- Decodable text

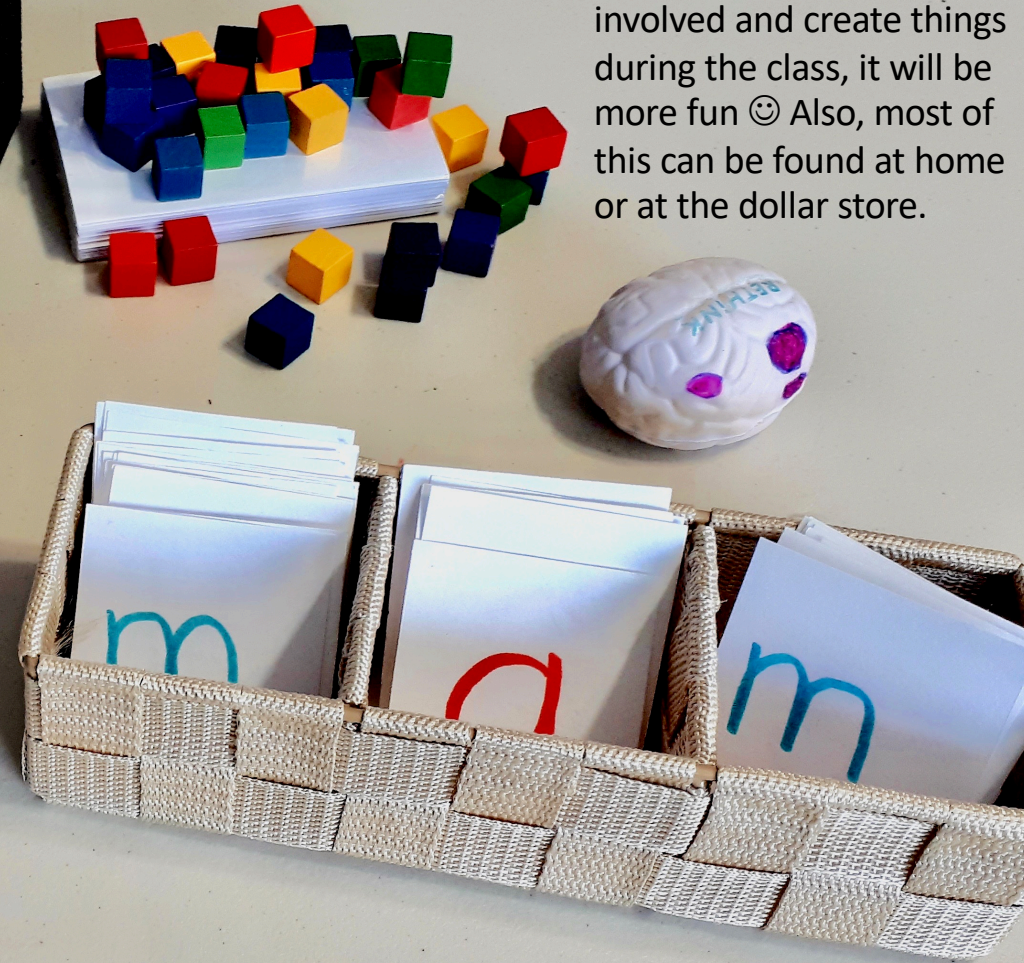

What to Bring

- Set of cue cards
(white on both sides – standard size – 5x3")
- Scissors

- Pen and Notebook for taking notes
